Special Report 2006 | Judicial Scorecard

The Washington Supreme Court is one of the most powerful bodies in the state of Washington, with its nine elected justices often upending the will of the state legislature, the governor and state agencies. The justices' influence can be felt in everything from the last say on initiative ballot titles to death penalty reviews.

The Court's clout is magnified because most voters do not understand the range of influence these nine elected officials hold over the way business is conducted in Washington. Its review of civil justice matters, including liability cases, repeatedly circumvents the intent of other elected officials who have put the issues through rigorous public legislative debate. Despite the great impact of the justices' decisions on daily life, voters ironically give the justices' philosophical views far less scrutiny than that of their local representatives.

The LRC has committed itself to an ongoing, biennial review of the significant liability rulings by the Court, assessing those rulings in light of the LRC's mission to curb lawsuit abuse.
